IMPORTANT INFORMATION ABOUT YOUR DRINKING WATER KENNETT PWS Failed to Meet Chemical Treatment Monitoring Requirements

Our water system, which is subject to compliance monitoring requirements under the Ground Water Rule, failed to monitor the residual disinfectant concentration or failed to monitor, record or report the disinfectant concentration for each day during **May 2024** by the 10th of the following month to ensure effective and reliable treatment of the water provided. Although this incident was not an emergency, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened and what we are doing to correct the situation.

What happened? What is being done? (Describe corrective action.)

What should I do?

- 1. For this type of violation, actions such as boiling drinking water are not deemed necessary for the general population. However, if you have specific health concerns, consult your doctor.
- 2. People with severely compromised immune systems, infants, and some elderly may be at increased risk. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. General guidelines on ways to lessen the risk of infection by microbes are available from U.S. Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

What does this mean?

This is not an emergency. If it had been an emergency, you would have been notified within 24 hours. Inadequately treated or inadequately protected water may contain disease-causing organisms. These organisms can cause symptoms such as diarrhea, nausea, cramps, and associated headaches. While we have not detected any evidence of contamination in our source water, we have failed to meet Ground Water Rule monitoring requirements.
